



Cake for a Crowd

Winter of '09, Dave and I traveled to Egypt. We rode the camels, sailed the Nile in a felucca, and made an adventure with memories to last a lifetime. Our journeys always are inspiration for my artwork and this was packed with colorful images and events ripe for the painting. After our return, I began an indepth project researching the mythology and customs of Ancient Egypt with plans to create a series of paintings to record my findings. I called my project *Lessons from the Pharaoh's Tomb*. The resulting canvases told stories of gods and goddesses. Each of the nearly 2000 deities from which to choose had specific roles such as protection of women, men, and children, some brought abundance, and others took souls safely to the afterlife. They were both male and female, and many were animals and birds or combinations.

Important traditions helped prepare the Pharaoh's voyage to the other-side. Vital to the journey's final destination and safety after the arrival was nourishment. *Offering Lists* have been found that describe how glorious feasts were laid out on long tables within in the tombs. Elaborate meals were presented in totality and consisted of fruits, meats, wine, cakes, and all varieties of foods. Gold, coins, precious jewels, and valuables were laid out as offerings also.

A special cake called a *shat-cake* was baked in the shape of an isosceles triangle. Because of its size and height, it had to be laid on its side and stacked creating heads and tails in a pile. An 18th Dynasty (1550-1298 BCE) tomb, showed an entire kitchen scene depicting *shat-cakes* being made, date flour being sifted, and others frying and stacking the cakes. A meal fit for a Pharaoh!

Recalling memories of our trips has helped me navigate the many months of isolation. I imagine all of you are engaged in such events too, longing for the time we can all gather again. Ladies, shall we plan to bake some *shat-cakes* for our next luncheon? I'll search for the date flour. Till then, Margret

Velva Stewart has been going through iodine treatment for her Thyroid Cancer.



"Wondering where all the 1932/34 Ford cars went? Read Memories of the California Jalopy Association by Thomas D. Luce. It is in its fourth printing, it is that GOOD. Available from tluce56@gmail.com for \$39.95 + shipping. It has a chapter on the pre-war racing, but it really takes off after WW2. There is a chapter for every year up through the 1960s as the Jalopies morphed in the Modified circle trackers of today. All through the '40s and '50s, Flathead Ford engines were FOREWORD BY PARNELLI JONES dominant, limited to one carb. Parnelli Jones is

featured as he began driving jalopies in 1953 at age 19. He was under the minimum driver's age of 21, so he needed an alias and fake ID. His true name is Rufus Parnell Jones. Nellie was a girl schoolmate that he despised. So 'Parnellie Jones' was created in order to get his race car driver's license at 19 yrs old. The book is profuse with original photos and interviews with the actual participants. Soft bound, the book is 5/8th" thick and a large format. I wish the photos were even larger. During the '50s, TV stations broadcast the races live in southern California, and of thousands of hours of filming [taping], only 38 seconds remain, the rest was lost. Today, mostly single black/white private photos and a few private 8mm home movies are all that remain. The sound of 30/40 racing Flatheads, racing in a pack, must have been intoxicating for the fans, who packed those race stadiums. Enjoy this one fans.
