

Carla Barnell forwarded this letter from the Portland Swap Meet Board:

"To the 6 Clubs that participate in the Portland Swap Meet:

The Portland Swap Meet committee would like to thank all the clubs for all their hard work this year at the swap meet. We (the clubs) successfully pulled off the Portland Swap Meet after not being able for 2 straight years because of Covid. Even with all the issues which Covid presented to the Swap Meet, we were able to successfully have a swap meet in 2022 without any known issues. Just being able to do this was a feat that not many could accomplish. Every club member who participates on the Swap Meet Committee or helped by doing swap meet duty should be thanked for their hard work. Some of the decisions which the Swap Meet Board and Committee needed to make over the last 2 years were not easy ones, but decisions which meant that the swap meet would survive Covid where many Swap Meets and Companies have not.

The committee is in the process of finishing up the books for the 2022 Portland Swap Meet and will be providing each club a detailed accounting of our expenses for 2022. Some positives to look at from this year's swap meet. All bills are being paid which the swap meet incurred for 2022. We had a great response from the vendors signing up for the 2023 swap meet and pre-registration is not complete until June 2022. We are also waiting on payments from PIR to pay their share of the traffic flaggers and shuttle buses which we should be receiving shortly. As many of you know things are costing much more then before Covid started because of inflation which we are currently experiencing. The swap meet is no exception to this, we incurred higher costs then we have seen in years past.

The committee would like to inform the clubs not to expect the first distribution at the end of April which is the custom. We are holding back any distributions at this time to make sure all expenses are paid for 2022. It is too soon to tell our total income from the 2022 Swap Meet so we can calculate each clubs distributions. Once we have completed our taxes in July, we should know better around August or September. The board is also continuing to look at all possible ways of reducing costs for 2022 & 2023. By doing this it will benefit all clubs into the future.

May 21, 2022 Joint Tour to WAAAM By Andrew Jackman

It was a beautiful day for a tour when 21 members of our Early Ford V-8 Club joined a like number of the members of the Rose City Thunderbirds for a joint tour to the Western Antique Aeroplane and Automobile Museum (WAAAM). We gathered at the Troutdale Outlet Mall near "Old Town Troutdale," from there we drove F84 straight through to Hood River. After exiting the freeway, it was a short drive to WAAAM where we were greeted with a brief introduction to the museum's collection. The folks at the museum were very knowledgeable and had many interesting stories to tell about the vehicles and airplanes on display.

WAAAM houses one of the largest collections of still-flying antique aeroplanes, motorcycles, military vehicles, and automobiles in the Country. There are several Early V-8 Fords included among the diverse array of cars on display. There was also a 1929 Ford 5-AT-C TriMotor aircraft, which is one of only a few that are still operational. In addition to the airplanes, cars and other vehicles, the walls surrounding the entire hanger were lined with various collections that had been donated to the museum.

It was a fun and informative tour. A good time was had by all who attended
