The event was hosted by Pat Parker at Filbert's Farmhouse Kitchen in Aurora, Oregon. 14 fabulous women attended. They had a private room with a fireplace, delicious food, and cheerful conversations. This recipe came up at the luncheon and the girls wanted it put in the newsletter. The rolls were once served at a club breakfast function held at the grange maybe 30 years ago.

Pat Parker's Rhonda Rolls

Dough: 4 c Flour

- 1 LB. Margarine**
- 1-pint sour cream

Topping: $1 \frac{1}{4}$ c sugar $1 \frac{1}{4}$ c ground nuts

2 Tsp cinnamon

Mix flour and margarine together with electric mixer. Then add sour cream and mix well. Shape into a ball and refrigerate overnight.

Next day - Divide dough into 4 equal parts. Roll out one at a time into 12-inch circles. Cut into 12 wedges. Sprinkle with ¼ of sugar mixture. Roll each wedge from outer edge to the point forming a crescent roll.

Bake at 375 for 25 to 28 minutes watch to golden brown. When cooled frost with a buttercream frosting.

Makes 48 rolls

**After talking with Pat, the margarine is the critical link—don't substitute butter. She makes these rolls for every family dinner—the family demands them. Definitely worth trying. Leftovers can be frozen,

"One Car's Journey"

My dad ran a small business in Manchester NH. In 1952 his banker contacted him about a car that the bank had just received as a part of an estate which the Merchants National Bank was to manage. Dad had a rotating stock of cars which he bought and sold, so the banker knew he'd be interested.

The car was a 1936 Ford Phaeton, in great

shape, and with about 11,000 miles on the odometer. The deceased owner was from St. Louis, MO. The story goes that the car was trucked from St. Louis to the Maine coast every summer, where the owner vacationed. Dad was told that the car had never been exposed to rain.

Dad bought the car, with a proviso that the banker was to receive the "first right" to purchase the car if dad ever decided to sell. Dad enjoyed the car until his passing, after which I received the car here in Milwaukie OR – by truck.

I recall slaving over the car applying "Blue Coral" treatments on a regular basis. This was a lengthy two-step process involving a cleaner first followed by a wax application. Then came the chrome polish and other detailing of the exterior and interior of the car. It was truly a labor of love.

I often drove the car from Manchester to the Hampton Beach area, in the heart of New Hampshire's eighteen mile coastline. As a teenager driving this beautiful automobile, I was flushed with pride. I'd cruise up and down the main drag, thoroughly enjoying the attention. I'd wind up staying at a family friend's house there before returning home.

The car now has about 31,700 miles on it. It's been repainted, and fitted with replacement canvas and new upholstery. Otherwise, the car is unrestored but in fine running condition. Dad did admit that the car was in the rain one time – he had it parked at the club where he golfed, and a sudden squall dropped a bit of rainwater on the car.

I am presently contemplating the future for the Phaeton. Sadly, the fixed driving position has become problematic for me. I can no longer drive the car for any meaningful distance without my bad back causing quite a bit of pain. I had herniated disk surgery back in 1968, and since then have had to be careful.

Who knows where the Phaeton's journey will lead to next? From St. Louis to Manchester to Milwaukie, the car has seen a lot of the U.S. I'll bet the best is yet to come!

East Multnomah and Clackamas County History Tour

The last stop before breaking for home was an outlook on the Columbia Gorge at the Portland Women's Forum. The view of the Gorge extends all the way to the Bonneville Dam. A great time was had by everyone, I only wish more of our members were able to attend.
