## A Repeat Bumper Crop of Green Peppers

I am sitting my kitchen reducing our abundant crop of tomatoes to marinara sauce and remembered this article from the October 21, 2021 Overdrive: "This year our



small garden produced 7 foot tall tomato plants and 2 foot tall pepper plants. We planted 1 red pepper plant which decided it was a green pepper and I was staring at 12 large green peppers and not a lot of time. Stuffed green peppers are easy to make and freeze well and are great for those nights "what's for dinner" deserves a better answer than drive-thru. So I dug out my Betty Crocker cook book, searched online, and put together this recipe:

## **Ingredients**

6 Large Green, Red, Yellow or Orange Bell Peppers

- 1 Pound of Lean Ground Beef
- 1 Small diced onion
- 2 Cloves garlic minced
- 1 Can (14.4 ounces) diced tomatoes
- ½ Cup Uncooked Rice
- 1 Cup water
- 1 Tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
- ½ Teaspoon Italian seasoning
- 2 Cups Marinara sauce
- ½ Cup Mozzarella Cheese, Shredded

## **Directions**

Cut top off each pepper and clean out the inside.

Cook in boiling water for 5 min, drain. (I used microwave for this step and you can skip if you want)

Cook hamburger, onion and garlic in skillet until hamburger is browned, drain. Stir in diced tomatoes with juice, water, Worcestershire sauce, rice and Italian seasoning. Bring to a simmer, cover and cook until rice is tender, about 15 minutes. Add ½ cup marinara sauce and stir.

Stuff each pepper with mixture. Stand upright in ungreased baking dish. Pour remaining sauce over stuffed peppers. Cover and cook in 350° oven for 45 minutes. Uncover, cook 15 minutes more.

Sprinkle with cheese.

Number of Servings: 6
